Loan Radio Batteries

It is only as time progresses that we find all the problems with different ideas or projects we undertake. A further item you need to take on board is the subject of batteries given to patients on the promise of payment the following night. It is not working out because of various reasons, the patients will end up with a free battery due to the following night not getting to the ward or the patient goes home or they don't cough up the money subsequently your night has used another of it's free quota.

Please Do not offer a battery to patients on the basis of payment at a later date. Credit is not an option we can afford.

It has been brought to my attention, that recently whilst on ward rounds some presenters are finding difficulty in approaching patients to pay for batteries. I have also been informed that you have provided batteries for patients by paying for them out of your own pocket. This is very commendable but it is not our wish that presenters should use their own funds. It solves the immediate problem of the patient without the working radio, but will create long term problems.

When actions taken by yourself add to the impression that we provide free batteries it increases the pressure on other presenters when asking patients to pay. The provision of free batteries to patients is limited, because of the financial implications for the station.

We would all like to offer a free battery service to the patients but it is just not financially viable. We need to educate the nursing staff, patients and their visitors that we are subsidising the sale of the batteries, and are not twisting their arm to buy the batteries.

If you feel uncomfortable in approaching a patient, with the prospect of asking for the money for a battery, or you feel embarrassed about the situation. Please talk to Gordon or pop along to see David and we will help you

improve your technique. In the meantime: please do not use your own funds to provide the loan radio, battery service.

We would be the first to admit it's not easy, but a little knowledge on technique can help.
