At long last an update has been received from the National Association. Only 57 members are actively supporting the campaign out of 345. A map of the UK has been supplied detailing where the rural areas might apply. If you are in a tent on Dartmoor or up a mountain in Wales or on a boat, on lake Windermere; we qualify, all other areas are defined as densely populated.
