A WOKINGHAM nightclub has been accused of breaching copyright after investigators heard hit songs being played without a performance licence.


Grabbers was caught red-handed playing a list of hit songs including top rap artist MC Hammer, Seal and even Kylie Minogue.

An investigator from London-based Phongraphic Performance, which owns exclusive performance rights on thousands of popular songs, visited the club in Evendons Lane and heard a number of songs.

As a result the company requested an injunction order at the High Court in London against Nite-Glo Promotions, owners of the Evendons Lane club.

The club's counsel guaranteed that the songs from the repertoire would not be played without payment of a licence fee. But Nite-Glo was ordered to pay the costs of the injunction application.
