In April 1991 all hospitals lost their crown exemption status which meant they now could be prosecuted in a civil court. The inductive loop radio system when installed benefited from crown immunity in that we didn't pay a full licence fee and didn't have to comply with all the aspects of the radio licence.

The recent correspondence generated between hospital radio's and the radio authority has made them aware of this change, subsequently they have decided to impose a licence fee and impose full compliance with the requirements of the inductive loop licence.:-

- 1) As from the 1st January a licence fee of £225 to be paid each year.
- 2)All output to be recorded for the station and kept for a minimum of six weeks (inc. sustaining service (24 hr's a

day).

On our behalf NahBo and Wireless workshop have been negotiating with the radio authority to reduce the recorded output; to the transmitted output generated by the station and not the sustaining service. They have agreed to this, saying only speech and adverts need be kept. It was the intention of the radio authority to backdate the licence fee till April 1991. Strong representations to them over the issue has prevented them imposing this but all stations will have to comply with the new fee from 1st January.

To set this up we will have to change the way we operate and the cost of this will add a bill of £700/800 to the running costs for next year. We have very little time left to set this up and changes which will be required will be notified to each presenter with training for team leaders on our legal obligations in the coming weeks.

A video recorder will be installed in the studio recording audio only at long play, which will give us six hours on an E180. The tapes will be rotated over the six week period.

Loan Radio Service

The Battery Question?

The recent profusion of graphs on the notice board about battery sales after the you an idea of how well the loan radio service is working on the wards. The sales are encouraging and are certainly up on the previous year.

The radio station is obliged to account for all monies received or used in the running of the station. This annual information is part of the submitted accounts to the charity commissioners. It makes our job very difficult if we can't account for money or stock.

What the graphs don't show is that during the first six months 55 batteries amounts of money and batteries. have disappeared and were not recorded in the battery log!!!!!!!!

The units may be free to the patients but they are not free to us. In this last month alone we have a discrepancy of six batteries already.

First impressions of the issue of your Feed-back. freebies indicates the station is within the target guidelines as laid down of 3 freebies per night in a three week period. strictest confidence. The un-recorded sales or freebies figure now puts us well in excess of our guidelines. This means we owe money to the trolley shop.

The good news is one member of the presenting staff has donated £50 to cover this shortfall of which we are very grateful for.

We cannot continue along this path and the whole project is under jeopardy unless we are more careful. We don't want to point the finger at any one individual but we require a team effort in resolving this. Freebies must be strictly limited: only desperate cases, we have no wish to suspend the service but

we may not have any choice

The message here is the station cannot afford to give away batteries in excess of the guidelines. Every presenter must record where that battery has first six months of this year was to give gone (Sale or freebie) or if you even put it in the station radio:-Record that Battery in


