## **III** The Right to Broadcast

As mentioned in last month's newsletter, the station from the first of January must hold a full licence and comply with the rules governing the issue of the licence.

The radio authority four page supplied a questionnaire asking questions where we had to justify our application. The hospital also had contribute that to application by supplying a letter of endorsement for the applicants. This caused a delay of over two weeks whilst we pressured the hospital to respond.

Wednesday 8/12 application was posted to the radio authority with our cheque and we now wait for the outcome. If for some reason we don't hear by Christmas eve, the station will not be in a position to broadcast from 1 January and not until such time as that licence is received.

The arrangements for recording of output will be finalised during the shut down period and I will be installing an alarm tied to the video which will mean vou will not be able to broadcast until the video is set to record. What has emerged from this latest bombshell is the fact that in the future if for some reason the video does not switch to record, we will not be able to transmit a program which is not recorded. No Recorded Output, No Programs.
