A big thankyou to all who have helped promote the loan radio service and done the sales pitch.






A room with a view (donation)

Gwyneth on ward one has three of our notification of number allocated etc. mugs which she purchased 7/3 & 15/3.



Graham Hyman from Tuesdays who joined Radio Heatherwood in March 93 has




Am service

suggestion was made to move the bedhead system rack from the plant room **EMI** building Radio Heatherwood's studio and scrap the existing unit which is almost twenty years old. The idea is Radio Heatherwood provides the manpower whilst the hospital pays for the cost of parts etc. It is also suggested that a new link be provided to re -instate the bedhead system on ward ten. The cable for ward ten was cut in 1988. An estimate of the cost and feasibility study will be submitted to the hospital shortly.

There was no definite commitment to install the am service in any new builds, but Frank Johnson did indicate a willingness to keep us informed of any major changes which might affect the am service.

Car Parking
Permits

Over the years communicating with the administration side of the hospital has always been an uphill struggle. Spare a thought for your colleagues on the trolley shop, I've still not been able to secure their car parking permits for this year and their list was submitted the same time as ours.

As with everything at this station it's based on practical experience, since the advent of loan radios the ward rounds of today are very much different than years ago.

Two persons collecting requests

One person selling batteries, checking radios etc.

One person floating, holidays, sickness, cover etc., ward assistance as per Team leaders instructions.

Loan RadioService

Each month a horror story, but it has to be remembered that any service you provide will be used and abused in some way, the loan radio service has been the best thing for the patients and not forgetting the radio in general, after all at least we know now that patients can here us.

Enter one radio presenter doing ward rounds, lady explains that she is not able to buy a battery, presenter does his best to find a radio with a battery in for her, explains that once battery goes that is it, it has been left by a former patient. One happy lady with radio left smiling. Two weeks later same presenter is on ward doing radio's on ward, opens locker where 4 this lady had been to find one radio with dead battery, lady in next bed tells him that he'll find more in the bottom of the locker. There were four more to be precise, all with dead batteries. This lady had obviously realised that she could get a free service with a little tale to tell. Unfortunately she didn't realise that she was causing an artificial shortage of radios on the ward by hiding the radios. As mentioned last month, looking for a radio with a battery in for a patient who says that they can't buy one, is a recommended way of perhaps relieving the situation, this lady just realised that a bit of cunning might achieve.

Next month, how to create space in the bedside locker, what happens if a radio requires a new battery.
