

Taking Requests


Why the half hour rule?

Over the years rules have evolved on this station because of conditions or situations which have occurred and these may have lead to some un-pleasant moments.

The original request collecting on wards was 8 records per half hour and give them a time, this lead to some monumental cock ups with five records for 8.00 and eight records for 8.30, request programs would grossly overrun and people would switch off because if there record was the fifth for 8.30 and they hadn't heard it by 8.45 click they turned off and would then complain bitterly the following night that the record wasn't played.

Timely Reminder to all presenters when collecting requests today you should take only 6 requests maximum per half hour and advise the patient their request The elusive mug winner listed as being will be played between the half hour time

they ask for a specific time say 8:30 say to them do you want it between 8-8:30 or 8:30-9. If you say yes, we will play it at their specified time you commit every night to do the same for that patient whilst their in because they use it as a lever, also you commit a particular style of music to be played at a time which might not mix well with the previous record.

Patients also forget once you have left what time they chose. A good reminder for patients as you finish taking the details is to say.(i.e. " Thank you Eileen for your request we broadcast from & 7.30 till 10.30 and your request will be played between 8.8-30 ") This serves two purposes it reminds them of the transmission times and also the time they chose.

This may sound as though we are trying to teach the older members to suck eggs but believe it or not we are all guilty of slipping

into standards which can do an injustice to the service we provide.

All presenters remember the half hour rule !!!! Don't specify specific times !!!!!!

Loan Radio Jaults

A fault which seems to have come to light recently is the radio which sounds distorted and off the station with very little volume. This is caused by the battery which is about to fail and gives the impression the radio is not tuned in properly.

🕹 Engineering Corner Am Service

W/E 29/7 nearly turned into a disaster for the loan radio service on wards 1,2,3,10, and the day surgery unit. The reason the hospital have started to renovate the mother and baby unit on ward two the aerial situated in this area was ripped from the wall, as the wall was to come down: an emergency repair by PJ has re-sited the aerial further down the corridor. I cannot over stress the need for Team leaders to make sure that all cable driver lights lit before are commencement of ward rounds. The next 5 years are to see some monumental changes to the layout of the hospital and our service on the medium wave is going to suffer every time they do work.

Despite from assurances loan radio leaflet is in the locker with the management we can expect un-told grief on this subject !!!!!

Why Grand Draw Why Not Something Else?

In the early days of Heatherwood fund raising by presenters was limited to the minority and only raised small sums of money these were organised by the individuals concerned who would in variably mean involvement by the other 20 presenters.

When the grand draw was started in 1985 the idea was that for very little initial organisation we could accumulate a large sum of money and involve everyone and the task is quite easy. People were given the

option to volunteer to assist with the selling but as before the people who organised it were left to do the work I distinctly remember sitting in maternity survived well on it over the last 11 years every Saturday afternoon and David can and will continue to survive if we work remember going round the wards every as Saturday on his own. this continued for contributing to the fund-raising and not the first three years when after every one as the early days where 5 individuals had benefited from the £3500 raised we decided to make time slots compulsory, an average eight hours over a three month period. If people want the benefit of the job as presenter they should arrange their social calendar accommodate their fund-raising. It is one of the only fund raising systems where very little effort is required, it promotes us in the high street and makes sure that all presenters give an equal share of time to the station and at the end of the day for 10p a punter could win a prize.

How do we replace it?

You need a system where everyone can be involved, very little organisation, it's not a task to obtain the money, and above all people will enjoy doing it and won't feel embarrassed ??.

We have tried sponsored radio programs or sponsored events and this hasn't worked well because of the hassle in collecting money or getting family or friends to sign the form in the first place.

The sweethearts balls, and the Radio Heatherwood supporters groups have produced regular income to the station but they rely on the input of a few individuals and don't involve everyone.

I don't believe there is any get rich quick scheme we can adopt nor do I feel we should abandon Grand Draw what we do need to do is perhaps improve the way it is delivered on the wards etc. One idea for next year we are considering is a different night each week will abandon programs to sell grand draw tickets around the wards at the same time set up a table to catch all visitors to the site?

If you can think of ideas on how to

improve our Grand Draw sales etc. let us know.

It may be old hat but the station has a team of 20 individuals provided the fundraising !!!!!



The reported fault for Studio one





If un-obtainable Secretary (PJ).



💹 Bedhead Radio System, Is it here to stay?

As it mentions in another article the

hospital will fundamentally change over the next five years as the layout and wards are changed. No provision has been made by the hospital in maintaining either system. Despite an offer to improve this system which we submitted earlier in the year. We have received no undertaking by the hospital. In the light of this, we have decided to withdraw our offer made earlier in the year. The continued demise of the system will eventually deny all wards of any

This state of affairs is exactly how we expected it to turn out. Ten years ago when we first looked at where things were going wrong, it was quite plainly obvious the bedhead system would be on a downhill slide.

This is not good news for us as it puts all the reliance on the am service which ordinarily could cope. This as you already know is under constant threat of damage from any building proposals.

Where we have to rely totally on the am service our loan radio's can at a stroke be rendered useless should building work interrupt any of our aerial cable runs.

The bedhead system on the general wards should it be cut will make no difference. The system however in the maternity unit will immediately be missed should cables be cut or the main amps fail.

The maternity unit as such will become surgical centre for the hospital: renovation to incorporate new operating theatres and the demolition of the general wards will go ahead.

We could find ourselves broadcasting to ourselves as bedhead cables are severed to the old wards which would bring down the service to the maternity unit. On the am front, cables which also stradle all the old wards could be severed taking out our service to ward 10 and the Emi unit.

Is the future rosy for the bedhead system?

Definitely Not !!!!!

Is the future rosy for the am service system?

Only if the hospital consult us !!!,
