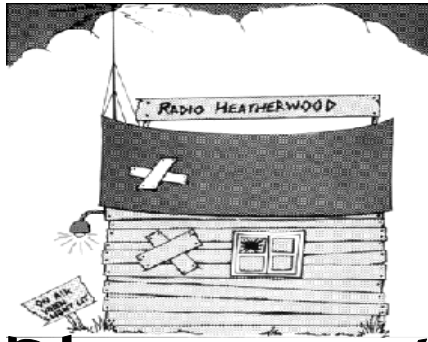

Time 9:27 Paul gives Lee a heart attack as he reads out the wrong request.

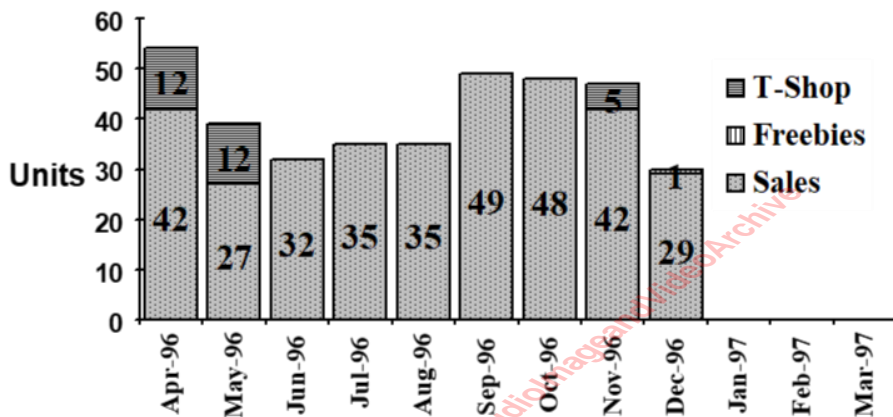

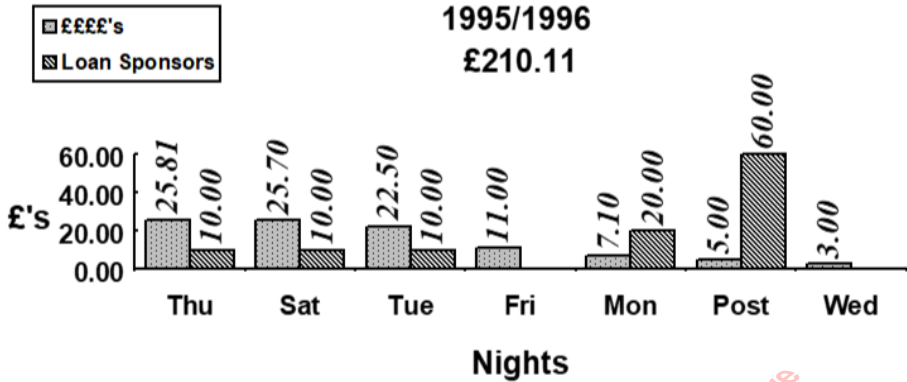

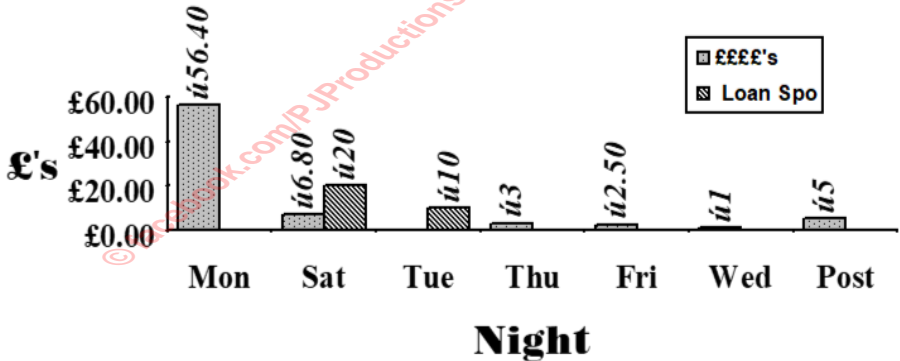

Operations

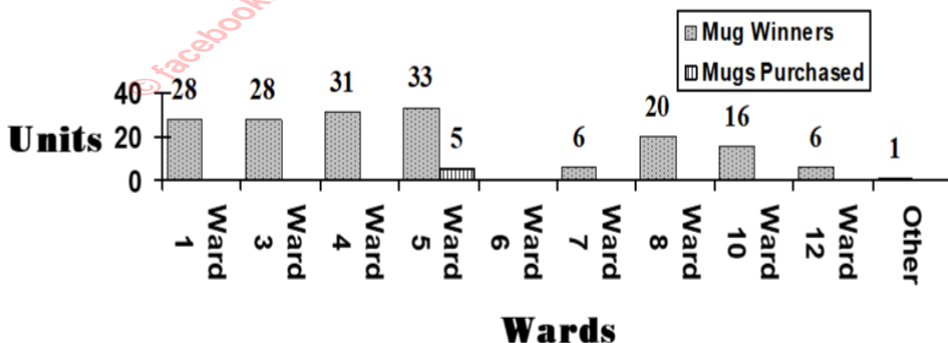
Manual

Special Meeting (October)

At the special meeting in October of Team-leaders a good natured discussion took place on various subjects and a few ideas surfaced from the meeting.

1) Trainee's will have a progress chart compiled on them. Problem trainee's will be swapped to other nights for a second opinion. A Three month make or break revue date on training.

2) A contact card for presenters to hold in their wallets etc with tel no's.

3) A move towards encouraging more outside involvement in programs by encouraging interviews.

4) A more collective response towards training of new people where all established personnel take an active part in improving the quality of training.

A discussion took place on the deteriorating state of the bed head system. In the next six months I envisage we will probably turn off the amps in the studio which provide the service. We are now down to just two channels working on the unit. The hospital are not supporting the service on the bedhead and are not likely to in the foreseeable future. More than ever it is important that ward rounds ensure wherever possible that a patient has access to a loan radio. These are your listeners. (See centre page)

PJ over the air had told the listeners he was wearing matching boxer shorts. The girls just wanted to have look and made sure Keith new about it.

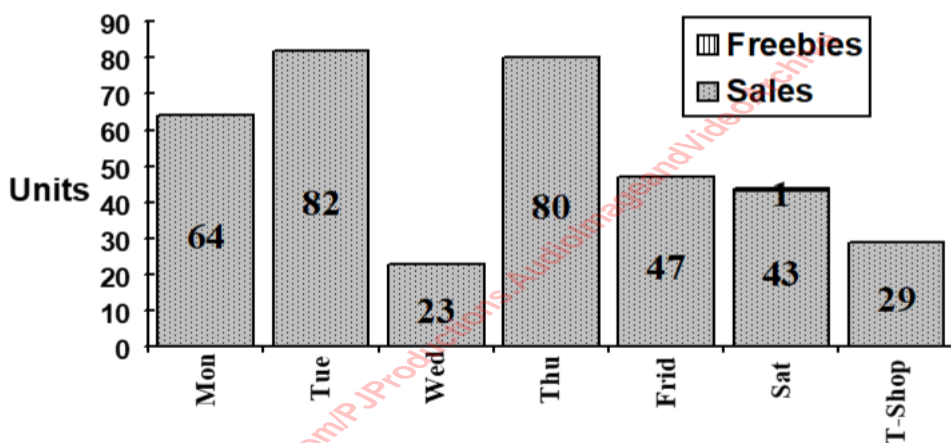
On return to the studio Keith promptly called PJ a Bar steward. It's funny that i've never worked behind a bar !!!

Engineering Corner

Headphones are beginning to cause a few problems: with a couple of the DT511's

suffering from use. A new pair of headphones has been placed in the studio's these cost £92 but every part of them is replaceable unlike the 511's.

If we move towards more pairs of the professional Dt100's we can expect to pay out £150 for each pair. Ordinary domestic pairs from Hi-fi shops are incompatible with the output of the studio mixers. Take care with them. (hence the need for donations).

The future for Radio Heatherwood depends on the collective support and ideas of the presenters. There are lots of new and interesting ideas out there which need nurturing and developing. We either take on board new ideas or we stagnate.

Radio Heatherwood is 21 this coming June this birthday is only possible by the contributions made by it's presenters past and present

The management team would like to thank all staff for their splendid support in 1996 and thank you for your contributions to the service which as I'm sure you know is very much appreciated by those patients listening on the loan radio service.
