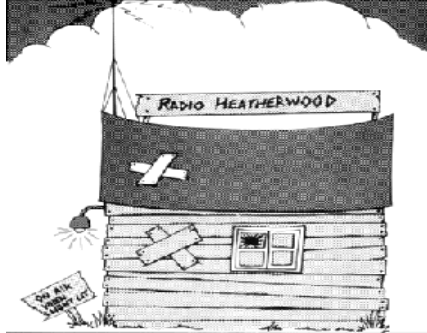

Hi Team

Over the last few weeks David has been doing an audit of the accessibility of Loan radio's on the wards. I'm afraid it makes for grim reading, of the 246 which have been allocated we can only find 103. At best you can make that 110 for the beds we couldn't reach. The split of these radios is 77 PP3 types and 26 of the AA type. We have always known a number of the radio's would disappear but 143 over the last ten years; it's a lot.

We need to be very proactive in ensuring sponsors come forward to raise the totals on the wards. This is how the remainder are allocated :-

Ward 1	17
Ward 3	9
Ward 4	24
Ward 5	20
Ward 10	18

Three new style radios are in the box waiting to go to ward 10 this week. They are AA types and the quality of them is much better. One thing to note is the volume of the headsets is not as loud as the old units but this is not critical.

When presenting your programs don't forget to mention to the patients the radios are useless beyond the hospital boundary and also to mention leave the radio in the locker for future patients.
