A patient who chooses a record which is personal to them will hopefully remind them of a good time in their lives we shouldn't spoil it for them!!!!

PPL

Last year we were advised that the PPL intended to charge all hospital radio's for the use of music on computers for automatic play out systems. Other hospital radio's have already received their requests for payments.

Rhapsody has over 12,500 copyrighted pieces of music and speech on the system. It is our intention now not to add any more unless there is a real need. Bearing in mind that we will be paying for this privilege every year.

We have received our copy of the licence which has raised a number of queries, we are currently seeking clarification. It's not good news for us as we may have to have a re-think on how we operate rhapsody and the live assist.
