

Hi Guys

I need to brief this out to you before we have an accident and someone breaks the fittings.

I have noticed in recent weeks there is problems in positioning the mike arms with the pop filter attached. The fittings on the pop filters are slack and keep losing their position. In addition people are over tightening the white wing nut or the other adjustments.

Today I have changed the pop filter position to clamp directly to the mike. This is secured in place with a black cable tie. This has the effect that wherever the mike position is the pop filter is exactly in the right position i.e. distance from mike. This means you should not need to keep adjusting the pop filter.

## **Mike Adjustment**

## White wing nut

Don't lock this down, otherwise the arm will not move freely.

# **Black wing nut**

This is the one you will use the most, having adjusted your sitting position if you need to pull the mike closer you can release the black wing nut and change the horizontal/vertical position. This only needs to be finger tight.

#### Caution

Do not grab the body of the mike to make any adjustments, always use the brackets to change positions

I hope this makes sense

A question we should always ask the patient when we are collecting requests. If you notice the terminal still has the headphones in the plastic bag Take the request and then ask " Do you know how to listen into us " if the response is not sure or don't know make sure you take time to set the terminal up. This you may already be doing but it's worth a mention.

Also a reminder wards 1G and ward 16 cannot listen to us on an am radio there are no aerials in these wards.
